Additionally, he represents the United Kingdom on a wide variety of ISO and European committees on management systems standards and has many years' experience developing, writing, and implementing management systems.

The ISO 45001 FDIS second draft was published November 2017. With the final version of the standard expected to be available in February 2018, ACT have planned its first seminar to take place promptly after this.
