- Helps engage people and facilitiates a team approach



Covid 'Spot Check Support Officers' (SCSOs)

use of body cams and/or audio recording

Extract from HSE email:

"We do ask the SCSO's conducting site visits to collect evidence of what they have observed in the form of notes & photos if required, and they also use body cams and/or audio recording of visits. Any evidence gathered is shared with HSE Inspection teams where necessary for them to follow up, as SCSOs do not have enforcement powers and any action in this respect would require an Inspector to intervene".

BHSEA Note:

Further clarification is being sought but in any event if you have someone come to do a Covid spot it is suggested that you check the authority of these people – they should be carrying a letter of authorisation - and accompany them at all times when on a site.

BHSEA Secretary – Vacancy

The Role: To provide the Association with a self-employed contract service. - Administer BHSEA website including Membership database and subscriptions.
- Organise Council, Management & Construction Committee meetings prepare agendas, take minutes, etc.
- Manage and monitor BHSEA and Construction/WWT bank current accounts income and expenditure.
- Liaise with BHSEA accountants in the administration of BHSEA finances.
- Promote the further development and simplification of policies, procedures and guidance.
- Gather information and assist in producing BHSEA Annual Report & Accounts.




