


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Introduction



15 People Injured in Salford Gas Explosion - November 2010











Construction health inspection initiative underway

HSE is carrying out its latest construction health initiative with health and safety inspectors targeting construction sites across Great Britain.

The initiative is now underway and runs until Friday 30 October.

The focus will be on protecting workers from <u>respiratory risks and occupational lung</u> <u>disease</u>; looking at the measures businesses have in place to protect their workers' lungs from the likes of asbestos, silica and wood dust. This is part of HSE's longer term health and work strategy to improve health within the construction industry.

<u>COVID-security</u> is a critical health risk and will also be covered by the initiative.

RIDDOR Reporting of COVID-19

This guidance is for the person reporting, usually the employer (known as the 'responsible person').

Members of the public and non-work-related cases

There is no requirement under RIDDOR (The Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 2013) to report incidents of disease or deaths of members of the public, patients, care home residents or service users from COVID-19.

The reporting requirements relating to cases of, or deaths from, COVID-19 under RIDDOR apply only to occupational exposure, that is, as a result of a person's work.

What to report

You should only make a report under RIDDOR when one of the following circumstances applies:

•an accident or incident at work has, or could have, led to the release or escape of coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2). This must be reported as <u>a dangerous occurrence</u>
•a person at work (a worker) has been diagnosed as having COVID-19 attributed to an occupational exposure to coronavirus. This must be reported as <u>a case of disease</u>
•a worker dies as a result of occupational exposure to coronavirus. This must be reported as <u>a work-related death due to exposure to a biological agent</u>
